“My Prayers are Being Answered” ~ Christina, IHN Guest

Christina and her three-year-old daughter, Jazzlynn, came to Family Promise’s Interfaith Hospitality Network on January 4, 2011. Within 30 days, the single mom and her daughter were making plans to move into a Partners in Housing manufactured home in a family park in Wyoming, Michigan. “I am overwhelmed at how quickly my prayers are being answered,” said Christina.

Christina was born in Mississippi but moved to Byron Center at an early age when her parents divorced and her mother moved back to her hometown in Michigan. She graduated from East Kentwood High School. After graduation, she worked at Meijer, Inc. but due to a work accident was unable to continue. Christina is epileptic which is sometimes challenging. She married in 2008 but recently separated from her husband. “I lived with a friend for a while. With no income as a stay-at-home mom, I sought help and was referred to Family Promise.”

“I feel like Family Promise represents my second chance to stand on my own two feet. Within a short time, we were discussing housing options, including the Partners in Housing opportunity,” she recalls.

Christina admits that she was very nervous at first. “I was nervous but I found everyone welcoming and very respectful. I have been overwhelmed by how quickly we were able to find a home for me and my daughter.”

“I loved the churches and volunteers. The people are so nice and you have your own room for privacy and sleeping. Yet, there’s also a family room where church hosts played games with us and where we watched T.V. I have been overwhelmed by how quickly we were able to find a home for my daughter and me” she continued.



What Happens to Children (When They Become Homeless)

- They are sick four times more often than other children.
- They have three times the rate of emotional and behavioral problems.
- They are four times more likely to show developmental delays.
- They are twice as likely to have learning disabilities.
- Their parents are likely to suffer depression and anxiety, leading to health problems.

- Refer them to community clinics if they are sick and provide medicine.
- Model good parenting habits and give stressed out parents new ideas.
- Put our faith into action and create lasting relationships.
- Surround them with people offering hospitality and encouragement.
- Support them in their hard work to regain their independence.

Families can now ride with dignity and respect as they travel to Host Congregations each night and to medical and other appointments with our staff and volunteers,” said Cheryl Schuch, Executive Director.

Our guest families have been overheard as they enjoy the ride:

The kids were thrilled. One little boy mentioned that he had never smelled a new car and couldn't believe he got to ride in one (while the van is gently used, it looks brand new).

Nicole, one of the mothers, said that she felt like she was able to ride with dignity now. She sees the hope the program and its supporters have in her and it helps her feel confident as she seeks employment and a permanent home.

Sharonda was so thankful to have a nice warm van to crawl into in the early morning with her young baby. She says “thank you” for taking one of her worries away.

“We deeply thank the foundations that provided the matching grant and the other friends and churches who responded to make this critical transportation possible,” said Cheryl.

Welcome New Board Members




Family Promise is pleased to welcome two new board members to our roster. Randy Locke is a Market Research Manager with Amway where he is responsible for

Creating a Bright Future!

With little change in our state's economy, families continued to face an up-hill battle last year to keep their jobs, homes, and basic needs for their families in place. The National Conference of Mayors reported that in 2010 there was a 9% increase in families with children becoming homeless. This is on top of a 22% increase in families becoming homeless in West Michigan between 2008 and 2009.

Despite the challenging environment, you helped the families we served to succeed! In 2010, over 500 people were served through the different Family Promise Programs. Through IHN, 93% of the 57 families you provided shelter for found a new home! Many of these families are on a new path to independence and self-sufficiency because of our network of over 1,600 volunteers who continue to walk with our guests in their time of crisis. More than 90% of the guests that moved out over a year ago are still independent, creating a lasting change and a bright future for their children and for our community!

I would like to thank all of our generous volunteers for their awesome donations of time the last few months. Of the many things that our volunteers can do, playing with kids is by far our guests' favorite activity. One of the moms currently staying with us just told me that her son isn't really excited to move into their place because of all of the volunteers he's gotten to spend time with! 
SEPTEMBER 19TH
